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Professor Eugeni Roura



Nutritional strategies aimed at reducing antimicrobial use in piglet feeds

Professor Eugeni Roura is a nutritionist with interests in digestive physiology and gut health, chemosensory science (including taste and smell) and transgenerational mechanisms relevant to pigs, chickens and humans. Eugeni holds a Veterinary and PhD degrees from the Autonomous University of Barcelona and a MPhil and a post-doctoral appointment at the University of California (Davis). He developed a 16-year career in the feed and food industries before joining the University of Queensland (2010) where he currently leads a team active in the interface between basic and translational research aiming at providing research services to industry and the society. Since 2010 he has graduated 20 PhD students in Australia and published more than 100 peer-reviewed publications. Eugeni is a member of the R&D and Educational Committees of APRIL, the National Committee for Nutrition (Australian Academy of Sciences), the Federation of Oceania Nutrition Societies (FONS), and President of the WPSA (Australia branch).
